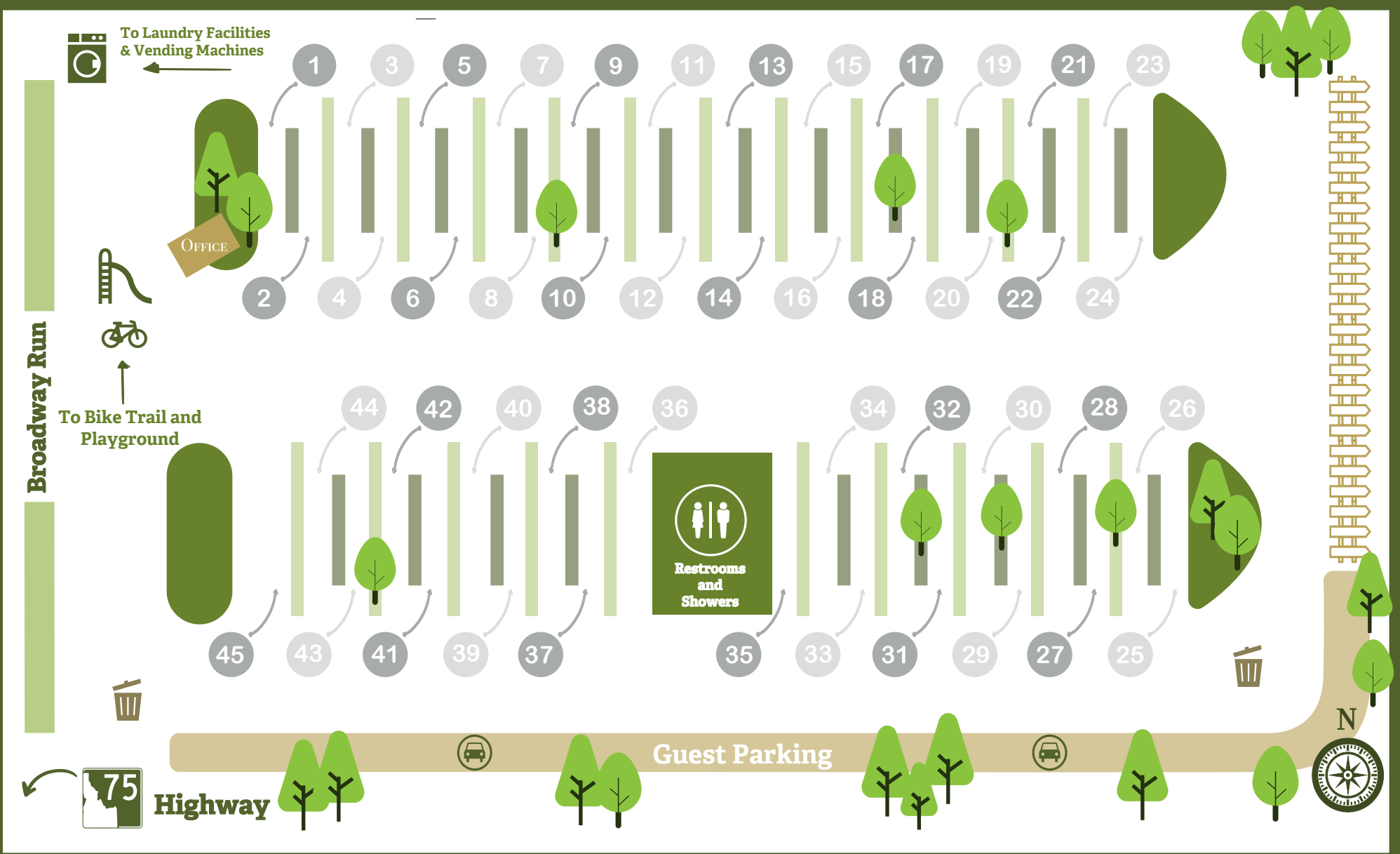

Ernest Hemingway finished *For Whom the Bell Tolls* in Suite 206 of the Sun Valley Lodge.
